




Installing your Bosworth Y-Valve

1 Identify the “Common Port”

The Common Port is the single port that a Y-valve handle arrow points to when the handle is turned from one position to the other.



Active Flow Path



Arrows on handle indicate active flow path

2 Connect the “Common Port” to the Common Fluid Source or Destination

For example, if your Y-valve is going to divert the output of a Macerator to either a holding tank or a pump, then the Macerator is the common fluid source. Install the Y-Valve so that the line to the Macerator is connected to the Y-Valve Common Port.
